


REFLECTIONS

PROGRAMS AND IMPACT

Children Led Community Peace Labs (CLCP-Labs)

The learning workshops offered invaluable experiences to teachers by providing them with tangible tools and profound insights through interactive sessions on conflict resolution, active communication, empathy-building, and culturally sensitive teaching, enabling the teachers to gain practical skills they can immediately apply within their schools and communities.

With financial support from We One Action Network and in collaboration with Inua Village to Global Foundation and GMI Church, Ongata Rongai, we



successfully held three learning workshops of CLCP-Labs in Nairobi, Vihiga, Kakamega, and Uasin Gishu Counties.

Key Achievements from the Workshops

- a. Establishment of Peace Labs in the schools.
- b. Increased awareness on the needs of children.
- c. More cohesive engagement between the schools and their communities.
- d. Children's comprehension of conflict and peacebuilding.
- e. Participation in the International Day of Peace.

Faith4peace

In Kenya, religious organizations and leaders play a pivotal role in fostering cohesion, harmony, and sustainable peace within communities. Recognizing the perceived neutrality of churches, a recent report underscores their potential to collaboratively bring about positive change and reconciliation. The Faith for Peace (Faith4Peace) Program, conducted in collaboration with Grace College in East Africa, is designed to enhance



the leadership skills and capacity of religious leaders. The program focuses on key aspects such as leadership, storytelling, conflict management, team building, and change management.

The training workshop, spanning two days, sought to deepen the understanding of 16 pastors and religious leaders on conflict resolution, mediation, create a shared understanding of the link between effective leadership and sustainable systems, and strengthenskills in story telling and conflict detection. The workshop's success shone through in the overwhelmingly positive feedback, boasting an impressive 95% satisfaction rate ranging from very good to excellent. The hands-on approach, practical components, and the workshop's alignment with participants' needs underscored its effectiveness.



In summary, the Faith4Peace Program underscores the ongoing significance of sharing knowledge and fostering development among religious leaders. It recognizes the evolving

Community Dialogues

Aim to empower communities by providing them with a space to actively participate in shaping conversations around their livelihood, development etc. The collaborative nature of these dialogues ensures that the diverse voices within the community are heard, contributing to a more inclusive and comprehensive approach to community building.

Teenagers for Peace

"Who I am"

Re-Imagining New Communities responded to the tragic death of a 16-year-old boy due to mob justice by initiating interventions to bridge the generational gap and foster understanding among the youth. As part of intervention, we conducted one session with young footballers from the Zuka Football team in Dandora, Nairobi.



The focus was on helping understand the importance of conflict resolution, discipline, community and building cohesive team. The teenagers learnt this through an activity called "Who I Am," that gives an overview of their communities, highlighting social amenities, recreational spaces, insecurity issues, economic activities, and relationships with neighbors. Through this activity, the teenagers were able to highlight their neighborhoods in terms in safety and insecurity.

Teenagers gained great insights on self-awareness, conflict transformation and recognition of



diversity. They also discovered varying family setups and backgrounds among their peers, as well as the challenges of being raised in volatile environments The session enhanced their understanding of their communities and recognized opportunities for talent utilization.

In conclusion, the overarching message conveyed was that; conflict can be resolved without resorting to violence, one doesn't to resort to petty theft to solve their

problems and understanding one another is key to building a peaceful community.

Kyatune Community Dialogue

The community dialogue involved 15 stakeholders among them 5 chiefs, youth representatives, ward admin, CSOs among others, who explored underlying factors within their communities.

From the discussions, and learning, youth empowerment emerged as a priority by addressing substance abuse



through mentorship and skill-based support. The complex challenges require collaborative efforts and strategic prioritization. Immediate action points included asset mapping to identify local resources and forming alliances with local stakeholders for effective problem-solving.

Research (Literature reviews)

Resource Conflict.

Early this year, we delved into the critical issue of resource conflict in Kenya, particularly in arid and semi-arid lands heavily relying on natural resources. The study explores conflicts stemming from climate change, environmental degradation, population growth, migration, ethnic rivalry, and political instability. The research question focuses on the causes and consequences of resource conflict.

Study objectives include analyzing historical, political, socio-economic, and environmental factors contributing to conflicts, examining stakeholder roles and interests, assessing impacts on human security and livelihoods, and exploring prevention and resolution mechanisms. The literature review highlights the colonial legacy, post-independence land policies, ethnic rivalries, population growth, climate change, and natural resource extraction as key contributors to conflicts.

In summary, the report emphasizes the need for a comprehensive understanding of the multifaceted causes and consequences of resource conflict in Kenya and advocates for sustainable and inclusive approaches to prevention and resolution.

Teenage Pregnancies.

In September, the we conducted a comprehensive literature review on teenage pregnancy in Kenya, emphasizing its global context, prevalence, and implications for health, education, and socio-economic outcomes. Approximately 15% of Kenyan women aged 15-19 experience pregnancy or childbirth, with regional variations, noted in counties like Kakamega, Samburu, West Pokot, and Marsabit, exploring causes and risk factors such as poverty, lack of education, early marriage, sexual violence, cultural norms, and peer pressure.

Data analysis uses the 2022 KDHS report to explore teenage pregnancy rates by county, demographic characteristics, and socio-economic factors. The literature review provides a foundation for nuanced exploration, encompassing historical, cultural, socio-economic, and policy dimensions.

The team aims to conduct interviews in Kakamega to gather more community perspectives, evaluate local policies, and tailor evidence-based recommendations for targeted interventions in the region. By engaging local stakeholders, we seek to uncover insights that contribute to addressing teenage pregnancy in Kenya comprehensively.

Communicating For Communities

Inua Village to Global Foundation

Re-Imagining New Communities provided support to Inua Village to Global Foundation in addressing their communication, branding, and campaign requirements. This assistance involved strengthening communication strategies through capacity-building sessions. The foundation's impact is now more effectively showcased, thanks to our collaboration.



Utugi Angels Community

Re-Imagining New Communities supported <u>Utugi Angels Community</u> by providing communication consulting services, amplifying outreach, and supporting advocacy efforts. Our collaboration ensured clear communication of the organizations' goals. This partnership enhances Utugi Angels Community's capacity to effectively convey its mission to a wider audience.



<u>Utugi Angels Community</u> is a registered non-profit organization that focuses on empowering individuals with special needs through a holistic approach. Their services span nutrition, healthcare, safety, psychosocial wellness, education, livelihood, cottage industries, environmental care, food conservation, and advocacy. They've positively impacted over 920 children and adults with special needs.

Impart Change

Re-Imagining New Communities conducted a self-awareness and conflict management training for 15 young women affiliated to Impart Change. The session empowered participants with valuable tools for personal growth, resilience, and effective navigation of challenging conversations.



Leadership, Entrepreneurship, and Technology (L.E.T.) Bootcamp.

For the second year, Re-Imagining New Communities partnered with <u>Steering</u> for <u>Greatness Foundation</u> in convening the annual Bungoma Bootcamp that that brings together school and out of school youth to learn about leadership entrepreneurship and how to leverage technology for their personal and community development.



CONFERENCES, TRAININGS AND SEMINARS ATTENDED

Content Creation and SDGS Training

The two-day interactive sessions on content creation and Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), hosted by Gamborious (vi) oxide brought significant benefits to the Re-Imagining New Communities. The training deepened our team's understanding of the SDGs, providing a solid foundation for aligning our initiatives with global sustainability goals. The emphasis on



content creation skills equipped the team with practical tools for effective communication in their peacebuilding efforts.

The training provided inspiration, innovative approaches, implementable ideas, and a hands-on approach to problem-solving, fostering a creative mindset within the team, a holistic toolkit to elevate and invigorate the organization's peacebuilding initiatives.



Institute of Economics and Peace

Through the Ambassadors Program, two of members gain access to the Institute of Economics and Peace's wealth of expertise and knowledge in the field of economics and peace. This knowledge transfer equips Re-Imagining New Communities with a deeper understanding of the economic factors influencing peace, enhancing their capacity to address complex issues within communities.

Kuza Amani Fellowship

The fellows program offered by the International Centre for Peace, Human Rights and Development in Africa (IPHRD) and One Tribe is poised to bring significant benefits to its fellows.

The fellowship offers a unique opportunity for the Re-Imagining New Communities team to engage with a diverse group of 25 young peacebuilders from Uganda, Kenya, South Sudan, and Nigeria.

The participation of Grace Wendo, our Admin Manager, in the fellowship program not only expands her knowledge and skills but also opens avenues for collaboration, cross-cultural learning, and the exchange of innovative ideas. This collective



experience positions Re-Imagining New Communities to elevate its peacebuilding efforts, fostering a more impactful and sustainable impact within the communities it serves.

Mediators Beyond Borders International Peace Congress

Participating in MBBI's International Peace Congress offered Re-Imagining New Communities a unique chance to broaden perspectives, learn from global experts, and collaborate on addressing the profound impacts of identity, belonging, and migration. This event enriched our toolkit for effective peacebuilding in diverse, dynamic contexts.



The Moth

The annual event hosted by Adele Onyango, gathered a global community to share stories on vulnerability, cultural norms and careers, becoming, and maturity. The event was held at the Catholic University of East Africa.



Andishi Africa Annual Dinner

The dinner brought together African and Children's literature enthusiasts to celebrate the diversity of storytelling, shared passions for literacy and positive change. Re-Imagining New Communities was represented by Grace Wendo.



ACCORD Youth Dialogue

The dialogue themed, Youth **Building Peace: Highlighting** Best Practices in Youth, Peace and Security at the YouthConnekt Africa Summit gathered young people from across East and West Africa to discuss their countries' National Action Plans for Youth, Peace and Security. They drew valuable insights from delegations from the Democratic Republic of Congo and Nigeria, who shared their experiences and best practices in implementing similar plans.



Regional Peer Learning Exchange on Conflict Related for Youth in the Horn of Africa.

A two-day regional Peer to Peer Learning Exchange on Conflict-related Trauma on Youth in the Horn of Africa organized by IPHRD, brought together youth from Kenya, Ethiopia, South Sudan and Somalia. Re-Imagining New communities' Executive Director Sahlim Charles, explored the Relationship between unhealed trauma and cycles of violence, and its detrimental effects on individuals and communities during a panel discussion. IPHRD is exploring ways to build upon the success of this exchange and support ongoing peer-to-peer learning initiatives in the region.



Re-Imagining New Communities participated and benefited from the Wellbeing Immersion Workshop organized by Mindful African Initiative and its partners. The workshop focused on educators'; self-awareness, capacity to provide emotional support to learners and explored breathtaking techniques for wholesome wellbeing.





Youth Religion and Mediation Course 2023



- Conduct a minimum of 3 leadership workshops in Kakamega, Mombasa and Nairobi.

Community Dialogues

 Hold 4 community dialogues in Kakamega, Vihiga, Nairobi, and Mombasa with teachers, farmers, local administrations, and religious leaders.

Participatory Action Research

- Conduct research on the role of parents in child evangelism.
- Conclude the research on teenage pregnancy in Kakamega.

- Continue supporting grassroots organizations in their efforts to foster development in their communities through capacitybuilding pieces of training on communication skills and documentation.
- Seek collaboration with more grassroots organizations that offer mutual benefit to the organization.
